



## What is *Quick Czech Clinic*?

*Quick Czech Clinic* is a weekend, walk-in medical clinic located in Prague Family Clinic. It is similar to an urgent or immediate care clinic found in retail stores, offering convenient, non-emergency medical care.

## When should I use *Quick Czech Clinic*?

*Quick Czech Clinic* treats minor, non-emergency health conditions such as ear, nose and throat infections, flu symptoms, pink eye, rashes, burns, and bug bites.

*Quick Czech Clinic* also provides camp, sports and school physicals with limited vaccinations. Parental consent and a current vaccination record are required. Well-baby / child visits are not conducted.

## How does *Quick Czech Clinic* work?

*Quick Czech Clinic* is staffed by Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants. Because *Quick Czech* is a medical clinic and not an emergency department, patients are treated on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of their reason for treatment or severity of condition.

**No appointments are taken.** Laboratory and radiology services are available in the event tests are ordered. *Quick Czech Clinic* does not refill maintenance prescriptions.

Following your visit to *Quick Check Clinic*, all follow-up care will be performed through your primary care provider, who will be notified of your *Quick Czech Clinic* visit.

## Do I go to *Quick Czech Clinic* or the emergency department?

*Quick Czech Clinic* is a non-emergency medical clinic that treats minor health conditions. If you have an emergency, call 911 immediately. Whether you go to *Quick Czech Clinic* or the emergency department is initially your decision.

Keep in mind that an emergency department treats the sickest patients first – not on a first-come, first-served basis – and longer wait times can sometimes be expected. The Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant on duty at *Quick Czech Clinic* will ultimately determine whether your condition should be treated in the clinic or the emergency department.

## What is a Nurse Practitioner or a Physician Assistant?

A Nurse Practitioner (NP) or a Physician Assistant (PA) has completed graduate level education and clinical training in diagnosing and managing common and complex

medical conditions. A Nurse Practitioner or Physician Assistant can provide a variety of healthcare services, including ordering tests, diagnosing illness, and developing treatment plans.

## Treatment List:
